

Dear Church Family,

When I first entered seminary, I was confronted with information that I had, up to that time, never been exposed to. In one of our required Old Testament text books, the author maintained that the first 11 chapters of Genesis were not historical. In other words, Genesis 1-11 were merely stories but not to be understood as history. Needless to say, this news resulted in several sleepless hours staring at the ceiling in my room.

I came to understand, quite frankly, that if this textbook author was correct, we have major problems because Genesis 1-11 introduces all the major doctrines of the Christian faith. In these early chapters of the Bible, we learn why we are here. We learn what marriage is; we learn who the tempter is, and we learn why the world and people are broken. We learn that a redeemer is coming and why we need Him. I could go on but I think you get the point.

After the initial shock wore off of being comforted by this new take on Genesis, I discover that many scholars and theologians did not agree with the above-mentioned text-book writer. These academics believe that Genesis 1-11 is indeed history. And that we should embrace them as such. (Jesus taught us to take Genesis as history.)

This brings me to announce an exciting opportunity that you (we) will have this month. On October 16, Keaton Halley, from Creation Ministries International, will be with us during the morning service. Their web site is <u>creation.com</u>. Creation ministries like this have made incredible strides in educating people in the reliability of the Genesis account and giving good reasons to believe what the Bible teaches. You will not want to miss this opportunity and you should be encouraged to invite friends and family to attend with you.

Now to another matter. As I write this, our church's new sign is partially installed. This sign will be the main communication tool that we have in our community. Yes, we have the church web site, weekly newspaper articles, radio program, and Facebook live still; however, we have found out through informal surveys that the church sign in where the majority of people learn about what's going on at Salem FBC. I think that it's appropriate that we have a dedication of the new sign in the near future—dedicating it to the glory of God.

Each sunrise seems to bring fresh reasons for fear.



Trustees' Report for October 2022

The trustees completed the following projects in September. The new ranges have been installed in the kitchen and were immediately used. I would like to thank Emil Nattier, Tom Reed, and a couple other men for making the arrangements of unhooking and removing the commercial kitchen range. The digital sign was installed on the afternoon of September 20th. By the time you read this article, the sign should be operating with messages and displays. Pastor Dr. Andy Dewitt and the church secretary, Glenda Lipe, will be trained on how to use it. Several positive comments have already been expressed about the appearance of the sign. A thank you to Kevin Keele in helping install a magnetic white board in nursery room 113. A thank you to Anne Coats for donating a large monitor for the Senior Adults Department and to Tom and Dina Reed for installing it. A couple of metal strips were also installed on the walls in the Senior Adults Department so magnet clips could be used for hold teaching materials. LED lighting has been installed for illuminating the flagpole and the side of the educational building to replace the old lighting system. The overhang on the north exterior sanctuary doors was painted. A step stop was installed on the bell tower exterior door. A thank you to Kevin Keele for helping with this project and fixing the bell tower door lock so it will turn easier.

The trustees are receiving bids for work on the construction of a women's restroom on the lower floor of the educational building where the library is. This restroom would be the first stage of renovation. Future plans include the renovation of the present women's restroom, making it a family and handicapped restroom with a shower and baby changing table. In addition, the trustees see a need for enlarging the present men's and women's restrooms in the sanctuary foyer. I want to thank those who have responded to the trustees' request for ideas on this entire topic. The trustees have discussed all of these responses. All of the trustees' proposed plans will be brought to the church business meeting for her consideration and action.

The trustees are also working on their line items for the 2023 church budget and presented a job description for the Maintenance/Security full-time support staff position to the Personnel Committee.






