Dear Church Family,

What would it look like if a church (that is, the people that compose a church) saw itself as a missionary enterprise or movement? I imagine that the people of the church would actively search for ways to reach out to their community in order to bring the Gospel to those who had not yet experienced it. April offers us a great opportunity to reach out. How so? Because April 9 is Easter!

Easter is one of the two times a year that non-Christians and nominal Christians are more open to attend church (the other being Christmas). Coming from the viewpoint of a missionary, this is a perfect opportunity to invite others to attend worship with you this Easter.

Easter (resurrection day) reminds us of the world-altering event of history, yes, history. Jesus rose from the dead. But not only from the dead but also in His glorified body. This event has changed everything. In light of this history-changing event, it makes sense for those with a missionary outlook to use the occasion to remember and celebrate Easter and invite others to do the same.

Even though sceptics question the historical reliability of Jesus's resurrection, the Apostle Paul states that the resurrection of Jesus is understood by appealing to five facts of history in 1 Corinthians 15.

- Fact 1: Christ died for our sins according to the Scripture (v.3)
- Fact 2: Christ was buried and rose according to the Scripture (v.4)
- Fact 3: There were eye witnesses to Jesus being alive from the dead (vv.5-7)
- Fact 4: Paul was also an eye witness himself (vv.8-10)
- Fact 5: This is the only Gospel that can save (v11)

If you are reading this, you are already convinced that Jesus died on Good Friday and rose again the following Sunday. Trusting in Christ has changed your life. You have moved from death to life, from darkness to light, and from slave to being set free. Many others have not yet experienced what you have. They are still slaves to their sin. They are still held captive by the evil one. This is why missionaries travel to far off lands to tell people the good news about Jesus. You don't need to travel to the far reaches of the world to find people in darkness; they live across the street. They hand you your meal through the restaurant window. They wait on you at Walmart. And they call you on the phone trying to offer you some service. They, too, are in bondage—they need the good news of Easter and you can give them that invitation.

Spring is in the air! While we can still expect cold and rain for a few more weeks, we will soon begin to see the budding of trees and the blooming of flowers. This time of year is known for new life. It is easy to see many more baby animals during this time and the first sprouts of the planted fruits and vegetables in the fields will soon appear. This season is so associated with new life that I believe it was intentional on God's part to have this season forever associated with the resurrection of Jesus Christ, the one who freely offers new life to everyone on earth.

New life is a concept that is found all throughout scripture. One of the most famous examples given in the Bible is in regards to the ordinance of baptism. Baptism, contrary to the views held by many churches, does not impart salvation. It does not make someone more worthy to get to heaven in the eyes of God. It does not even "wash away" our old sin. God declares that "...though your sins are scarlet they shall be white as snow..." (Isaiah 1:8). This is done through his forgiveness and grace alone. Baptism does serve an important purpose in publicly declaring what God has done through the work of Jesus. Paul explains in Romans 6:4 that "...we were buried with Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too may walk in newness of life." Baptism is the ultimate symbol of our new life in Christ. It is a physical demonstration of our death to our old self and our resurrection to our new self.

Another great example of new life is the future new life we have to look forward to. The Bible is full of promises regarding heaven. Revelation 21 describes in detail what our future will look like. It describes heaven as a place where "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; grief, crying, and pain will be no more, because the previous things have passed away." (Revelation 21:4). What a wonderful promise from God. We can rejoice that one day we will be resurrected just like Jesus was. On that day, we will be reunited with all of our loved ones who have accepted Christ and join with them in eternal fellowship, praising and worshiping God together. What an incredible thought this Easter season.

During the months of January, February and March these projects were approved and completed by the trustees' and others. All the first aid kits were updated with new supplies and two new blood pressure monitors were added to kits. Thank you to Barb Helpingstine and Pat Hampton for completing this for the church. The two trees bought last year were planted out by the play ground area. Thank you to Debbie Dodd, Debbie Pugh and Susan Wieldt for following up on this. Burned out parking lot lights on the eastside replaced with led lighting. Leaking toilets in the nursery and ladies restroom repaired. Outside entrance door to the office area was also repaired.

Light fixtures throughout the church have been converted from fluorescent bulbs to LED bulbs. A big thank you to the following individuals who helped with the project Tom Reed, Gary Watson, Ronnie Donoho, Susan Wieldt, Debbie Pugh, Debbie Dodd, Dallas Bundy, Frank Harris, Clinton Baker and Kevin Keele. They switched out 274 fixtures, removed 548 ballasts and rewired light fixtures and installed 1004 LED light bulbs.

The new ladies restroom was approved by the church in a special business meeting Feb. 27th. Wayne Stevens construction will start the project sometime in mid May. The restroom will go where the library currently is located and the library will move to the parlor location. Anyone interested in helping with the move of the library please get with a trustee.
