## Pastor Dr. Andy DeWitt

Dear Church,

Do you pray? I know the answer—yes, you do! Are you satisfied with your prayer life? Assuming you are like the majority of Christians, your answer is no. Our prayers are often repeating the same types of words that we have used over and over. (You can tell when this is true when a person that's praying uses the well-worn, often repeated words.) We often learn to pray by listing to and imitating the prayers of others. And I'm sure you are aware of Paul's instruction to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thess. 5:17).

So why is it so hard to maintain a consistent prayer life? In a word it's discipline! It's hard because we are pulled away by other activities—watching TV, checking email, and using that time-robbing device—your smart phone. (Have you ever fallen asleep when you were trying to pray?) Understand this: To live as a Christian requires sacrifice. If you are unwilling to sacrifice, you will not live like the Christian that Jesus requires. "Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me. <sup>25</sup> For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will find it" (Matthew 16:24-25).

I wish to shift to another aspect of prayer that you may not be aware of. Across from the office there is a room dedicated to prayer. Room 100 is our prayer room. You are welcome to use it. You can use it during the week when the office is open, it can be used before and after any service that we have and it is available during services. It is a place to be used for prayer.

In addition, we have acquired a Prayer Stand that will be in use during various opportunities. Many of you saw it in the auditorium when it was set up for a couple of weeks. Its first use is on April 8 during the solar eclipse. Our parking lots are available for free parking and we hope that some of those using it will want to receive prayer for their needs.

A third prayer opportunity is on the first Monday morning each month. We meet at 6 AM for prayer. I know that this is a challenging time; however, one must be committed to prayer to meet with others in the church auditorium to pray. J. H. Jowett wrote many decades ago a timeless truth: "Ministry that costs nothing, accomplishes nothing." Ministry, all types of ministries and service for God, requires sacrifice. It always does!

C. W. Renwick reminds us, "The only footprints on the sands of time, that will really last, are the ones made after knee-prints!"

# Associate Pastor Christopher Spenner

One of the most underrated virtues in the Bible is the practice of perseverance. We focus on the commands to love, obey, and serve, but perseverance is usually the key to all of them functioning well. If you've ever had to endure a long experience for your children or maybe even stick to an annoying diet, you'll know well how important perseverance is in accomplishing anything. This mindset is also extremely important when it comes to our church and how we grow it.

One of the best Biblical examples of perseverance is Nehemiah. This man was stuck in Persia serving as a cupbearer for the king of Persia. He was Jewish by birth and knew about his homeland, especially the city of Jerusalem, and would ask traders about it all the time. One day he heard very distressing news that the wall of Jerusalem was in shambles and the people who remained there were at the mercy of all of the enemies around them. Nehemiah did something very important after hearing the news. He prayed and asked God to intervene.

As usually happens when we pray to God asking Him to fix a problem, God gave Nehemiah himself the opportunity to fix it. God graciously laid on the King of Persia's heart to give Nehemiah all of the materials he needed to rebuild the wall of Jerusalem and sent him back to work on it. Nehemiah may have thought the hard part was out of the way but it was only just beginning.

As soon as he arrived, he encountered opposition. Enemies of Israel tried to distract Nehemiah and keep him from completing work on the wall. They tried persuasion, raids, and even an assassination attempt on Nehemiah himself. At any point during this work, Nehemiah could have given up and likely returned to his cushy job as a cupbearer. However, he knew how important this work was for God and he was determined to persevere. Eventually the wall was finished and Jerusalem was restored to a place of safety for God's people.

How does God call us to persevere today? James tells us in chapter one of his book to "count it all joy when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness" (James 1:2-3). He continues by saying, "Blessed is the man who remains steadfast under trial, for when he has stood the test he will receive the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him" (James 1:12). We most often will need perseverance to endure in our faith through all sorts of trials set against us by a world that does not understand God or His will for the world. We are ridiculed for our faith and made to feel like fools for trusting in God. Perseverance is key in ensuring we do not fall away in these trying times.

One last thought on this topic comes from Hebrews 12: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:1-2). Jesus is the perfect example of perseverance. He gave up everything in heaven to come and be our sacrifice, all out of love for us. As we go through our trials in this life, let us call to mind Jesus who went before us and gave us a pattern to follow.

Thanks to the generosity of our church family for their continued support of our special offerings and ministries.






Meet J.J. Jasper




