Dear Church Family,

August is here and you may be wondering, as I am, where the summer has fled. We measure summer, often times, when school is dismissed and when it resumes. Well, the time has arrived that Walmart hits you in the face with back-to-school supplies when you walk through the doors (that is, if you are not entering by the Beer Garden ② So, a new school year is about to begin. Kids are probably a little anxious about what the next grade level will mean for them. Will it be a good year or a tough one? But it's a new year; a time to begin again.

In a couple of weeks, we are scheduled for revival services (August 18-21). Rev. Sam Moore will be preaching and Stephen Brubaker leading music. This, too, is a time for new beginnings. In Acts 3:19-20, during Peter's second sermon, he tells his listeners about an opportunity that the Gospel of Christ offers. He said, "Repent therefore, and turn back, that your sins may be blotted out, that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord..."

First repent: this is an interesting word that basically means a change of mind that results a change of behavior. But this is not merely a moral statement. In order to repent, one must turn from his/her sin and turn to God. Secondly, this is furthered emphasized with "turn back" or as the NKJV renders it "be converted." It's more than being sorry for your sins; it's turning from your sin to the living God. In the midst of this God does the truly amazing thing—He makes a person into a new person spiritually. Paul, states it this way, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come" (2 Corinthians 5:17, ESV).

But there're the results mentioned in Acts 3:2. "times of refreshing" will come. Getting "right" with God; turning from sin to Christ, results in "refreshing." This is the joy and freedom that comes from a relationship with the Lord. Do you want this? If so, it is available when you experience revival. This is turning from sins and returning to Jesus. This is the reason to have special services that are out of the ordinary that offers the opportunity to be revived.

What should you do? Pray for yourself and for others to experience this refreshing from the Lord. Secondly, pray for God to anoint and use both Sam and Stephen as they lead us. And pray that you will have opportunities to invite others to attend, too. One more thing—it should go without saying--but attend!

Have you ever heard the phrase, "I don't have enough faith to be a Christian?" It is a pretty common refrain amongst those who consider themselves to be atheistic or agnostic. Faith has a reputation among these kinds of people as something irrational or superstitious. To them, having faith in Christ is equivalent to believing in ghosts or goblins. It's a fairy tale with no actual bearing in reality.

Unfortunately instead of combating these claims, many Christians have accepted this label without a fight. They have proudly proclaimed that of course Christianity isn't rational. How can it be? We believe in miracles and the supernatural. That can't possibly be logical or rational, can it? Unfortunately, while it can sound great to tell someone to "just have faith," it betrays a history of great intelligence found within the Christian faith. Our faith is reasonable, rational, and logical in addition to life-changing and supernatural.

Those who reject God typically have a worldview that posits that there can be absolutely no supernatural activity of any kind in the world. This extends to the origin of life itself. Those without God must accept that one day, by random coincidence, chemicals mixed in such a way that life arose out of non-life. This totally random result has never been recreated in a lab and likely never will be. Why? Because even the most basic forms of life are far more complex than anything we can create. We do not even know how to create an actual consciousness!

So the non-Biblical worldview hinges entirely on the most non-scientific argument in order to even get its footing. But life isn't even the most difficult hurdle for them. Their biggest issue is that they must accept that logical argument is possible at all in a world governed entirely by chaos and randomness. When you really delve into their arguments, you find that they don't have a leg to stand on.

By contrast, the Biblical view is foundationally built upon logic. How could it not be, with a God who embodies logic and order? He shows us this logical aspect of Himself right in the first chapter of Genesis, in fact. When he creates, he creates according to kinds. When he forms the stars and planets, he does so in order that they show the times and seasons. There is no chaos in God's design. Everything is purposeful and planned.

One great response I've heard to "I don't have enough faith to be a Christian" is, "I don't have enough faith to be an atheist." I think that statement is absolutely true. It takes far more faith to believe that all of this wonderful creation we see around us could have manifested by pure chance. All that said, it is not a good idea to base your life entirely on logic, either. The Bible says in Hebrews 11:6, "Without faith it is impossible to please Him (God)." In that same passage we find in verse 1 that, "Faith is the certainty of things hoped for, a proof of things not seen."

The main point is that our faith is not to be a blind faith. We should approach God not just because he is all good and all merciful but because without him nothing else makes sense. He is the upholder of the universe and has a perfect plan. As you spend this month inviting people you know to participate in revival, I hope you will be able to respond to any arguments they may bring up. Remember what Peter says in 1 Peter 3:15 and "always be ready."

Women on Mission/Library



God promised numerous times in the Bible to take of Israel, to bless those who blessed her and curse those who cursed her.


Eye to Eye carefully details dates and catastrophes which ensued after Israel was persuaded to divide her covenant land.


