Dear Church Family,

I hope that you have had a great summer season thus far. I do acknowledge that for some of you there has been sickness, surgeries, and other medical concerns that has come along with the warm weather of summer. I, too, have concerns and challenges of my own. If you are like me, these "disruptions" can take a lot of both physical and emotional energies.

But instead of focusing on these things (even though they are important), think along with me about something that's wonderful. Before I get to what's on my mind, first consider the following. Most people, when asked about heaven; specifically, how do you go there, respond with a common belief: "Live a good life and you will go to heaven." The reasoning is: good people go to heaven and bad people go to the other place. Of course, the majority of folks believe themselves to be basically good.

The Apostle Paul addresses this issue while writing to (most probably Jewish believers in Jesus) believers in Romans 3. He writes: "Because by the works of the Law no flesh will be justified in His sight" (Romans 3:20). And then he adds, "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (23). The option of being good is not a possibility because what a person might call "good" is not good enough in God's sight. This is distressing news. If our best attempts at being good will never be good enough, then what do we do? Paul does not leave us in despair. Rather, he continues in verse 24, "being justified as a gift by His grace though the redemption which is in Christ Jesus." The good news here is that our acceptability to God is given to us through Jesus. In other words, it is Jesus' righteousness that is given to us when we trust Him as our Lord and Savior. Neither you or I will ever be good enough in ourselves. This is why we need a savior. Paul further asserts, "For we maintain that a person is justified by faith apart from the works of the Law" (28). Faith is trust in a person, that is, in the Lord Jesus Christ. He did what you or I could never do—live a perfect life. Therefore, trusting in Him we receive His righteousness and are able to be accepted by God.

So, however your summer is going, rest assured that you are "right with God" though Jesus Christ. It's in Him that we have hope and assurance of heaven--Jesus and Him alone.

Have you ever felt like things are worse today than they have been before? Do you look at the world around you and wonder why people seem so uncaring about being "good people" or about spiritual things? It may seem like things are as bad as they've ever been, but the Bible speaks of a similar time period characterized by wickedness. Despite the issues of the day, God uses His faithful people to shine the Gospel's light into a dark world.

The time in the Bible being referred to is a difficult time found after Joshua's conquest of the land of Israel from the Canaanites. Joshua was the next to lead the people of Israel after Moses and he carried the torch well. Under Joshua there were some mistakes made, but in general his time was noted for the Israelites walking faithfully with God. However, after Joshua's death, things went downhill fast.

The Bible records all of this in the Book of Judges, which contains accounts from a four hundred year period where the Israelites were constantly failing to follow God. But there is an interesting account found at the end of this book that is recorded somewhat out of order. In Judges 18:30, we find the end of a strange account of a carved idol being set up. A character mentioned here is Jonathan, the son of Gershom, who is the son of Moses. (Some Bibles read Manasseh but Gershom is referred to elsewhere as Moses' son.) What really makes this significant is the following chapter, which is a very gruesome account of a Levite's concubine. The big kicker is this: It took only two generations after Moses for the people to fall away from God and embrace the brutal traditions of those living around them in the land.

This might sound bleak, knowing that at any time the church is a generation away from losing its focus on God. However, while the time of the Judges is characterized by a weak Israel, there are heroes who stepped up and continued to follow God. These Judges were often mighty warriors sent to save Israel via a military victory, but many of them showed great faith in God as well.

One of the best examples here is Deborah. Deborah is the only woman recorded as being one of these Judges and God revealed to her in a prophecy that the champion of Israel's enemies named Sisera would be undone by Barak, the military commander. However, due to Barak's cowardice, the victory would instead be given to a woman named Jael. The song of praise given by Deborah and Barak after the victory found in Judges 5 is a great indication of their dedication to God.

God has told us in Hebrews 13:5, "...I will never leave you nor forsake you." Even when the world around us looks bleak we can take comfort that God will be with us. What God requires of us is to be faithful to what he has commanded. If we do this, we will be a light to the people around us and we may yet see a turning back to God in our nation.



During June, several projects have been completed. One project involves lights in the sanctuary. Since Top Electric Company had the use of a 26-foot lift, they were able to change all the spotlights in the auditorium as well as the bulbs in the pulpit chandelier. The company still has a work order for changing bulbs in the middle balcony chandelier, adjusting some spotlights on the stage area, and installing lights on the east steps in the sanctuary. While working on these lights, an informational sheet was made describing the bulbs needed for each spotlight and chandelier in the sanctuary. This informational sheet will be given to each trustee and the pastor. A copy will be included in a church facilities' informational handbook being made by the trustees and kept in the office safe, and another copy in the church office filing cabinet. Emil Nattier II, Joyce Scrivner, and Myron Lloyd assisted in aiming the spotlights to light up the right location on the stage or the musical instruments. Thank you for this help.

Other projects completed include: The roof drainage system and gutters on the southeast corner of the educational building have been inspected to see that water is draining freely. A thank you goes to Debbie Dodd, who is in charge of the trustees' Kitchen Committee, for purchasing some new drinking coolers to replace some that had mold in them that could not be cleaned. A thank goes to Mike Pugh for helping replace a pulley and belt on a first-floor air handler and a malfunctioning emergency light. A thank you goes to Ken Smith, Ronnie Donoho, and Christopher Spenner for making sure the church vehicle got its six-month inspection.
