### Dear Church Family,

What would it look like if a church (that is, the people that compose a church) saw its self as a missionary enterprise or movement? I imagine that the people of the church would actively search for ways to reach out to their community in order to bring the Gospel to those who had not yet experienced it. I suspect that the people of this church would not be seeking their own comfort, but for ways to bring comfort to those yet to be reached. I envision that a church with a missionary perspective would learn ways of speaking so that those yet to be reached would understand what was being said. Our Lord was, of course, is a master of this.

For example, when Jesus was speaking to Nicodemus, He spoke with him about being "born again" in John 3. Nicodemus should have understood being a teacher of the Old Testament. He should have remembered Ezekiel 36 when the prophet wrote of God giving His people a new heart and a new spirit. That God's people would not only obey the Lord but would want to obey Him. In John 4, Jesus meets a woman of Samaria by Jacob's well. She didn't have the Old Testament background or knowledge of Nicodemus so Jesus did not speak of being born again. Instead, he communicated the same message but used a different image that the woman would understand. Jesus told her of "living water." And the Lord is not done. In John 6, speaking to some of those that were part of the feeding of the 5,000, Jesus didn't speak of being "born again" nor "living water," rather, He spoke of the "bread of life." In all three of these encounters, Jesus told people the same message (He is the way of salvation) but used words that those to whom He spoke would understand.

A church that sees itself as having a mission to accomplish will also be sensitive to communicate in ways that others, who may be unfamiliar with Christian lingo, understand. When missionaries are deployed to the country that they are to serve, often the first two years are spent learning the language and culture. Learning the native language is essential. Otherwise, quoting from an old movie, "What we have here is a failure to communicate" (Cool Hand Luke, 1967). So, a church should also learn about the culture where it is.

Our church moto for 2023 is "Every member is a missionary at Salem FBC." I hope that we, all of us, can learn to see ourselves as missionaries—for, indeed, that is what we are! (Matthew 28:16-20)

Greetings Church Family,

What an incredible first month this has been. While my family is still in the midst of moving all of our belongings from Florida to Illinois, the move to this church has been incredibly easy. We are encouraged every week by your concerns and comments towards us and we look forward to getting to know all of you better over the coming months.

As I began to write this article, I thought about the idea of urgency. In my family, urgency has always been kind of a joke. When I lived in Pennsylvania, we used to joke that if we made it to church five minutes late, we were on time. This was not an attitude that just extended to church, but often for other appointments as well. This was largely caused by my brothers and I having absolutely no sense of urgency ourselves. While it never caused too many issues, it was clear that if anyone besides my parents felt that urgency, we might have gotten to places on time more often. In this same sense, I feel it is important that we as a church always keep a sense of urgency.

In Revelation 22:12, Jesus says "Look! I am coming soon, and my reward is with me to pay each one according to what he has done!" Jesus Himself stated that His own return was coming soon. While we may not think of almost two thousand years as soon, it is of course no time at all to God, who "...is being patient towards you because he does not wish for any to perish but for all to come to repentance." (2 Peter 3:9). Besides this, Jesus wanted believers to feel a sense of urgency, so they would not know exactly when his return would be and thus stall in doing the works He prepared for them.

As we remember our church motto and our call to be missionaries, we must not forget the urgency of our mission. Jesus could return tomorrow and the work of the Gospel that we left unfinished today would remain unfinished. While God can accomplish His purposes as He wishes, we must never take for granted that He has allowed us to be a part of those works. We need to be faithful in our ministry every day and do so urgently as we prepare for Jesus' return. "And let us take thought of how to spur one another on to love and good works, not abandoning our own meetings, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging each other, and even more so because you see the day drawing near." (Hebrews 10:24-25)
