Dear Church,

As I finished typing the first two words of this article, it struck me. These two words are stated in our conversation frequently, at least, from my lips they are. "Dear" is a word of endearment, a word that communicates a degree of affection. The ancient Greek language (which is the original language of the New Testament) has five different words that are translated into English as "love." Four of the five are used in the New Testament. The word in Greek that comes nearest to "dear" is the word is *phileo*. This word is the root of Philadelphia (city of brotherly love). This is how we, as Christ-followers, are to treat each other. Paul writes, "And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you" (Eph. 4:32, NKJV).

The second word is "church." In the New Testament, it is not used to designate a location as it means so often today. It refers to people. The church is and always is people. The church is not a building that has a physical address. Rather, it is a group of people that meet together in order to worship and praise the Lord and to learn and to encourage one another (these, too, are expressions of worship). This is why meeting regularly together is so important (see Hebrews 10:25). Remember this–unfortunately many professing Christians today have forgotten this if they ever understood it in the first place. Again, Paul reminds us, "Husbands love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her" (Eph. 5:25, NKJV). This is a powerful example for husbands, but it also indicates the place of the church (people) in Jesus' heart.

One example of a church that was dear to Paul's heart was the church in Philippi. Many Bible teachers love this short letter. It's filled with joy, love, and hope. Paul tells the people of this church: "I thank my God upon every remembrance of you" (1:3, NKJV). Oh, by the way, are there fellow believers who could say that to you and be telling the truth? Some think that this church was problem free; they didn't cause any worry for the apostle like Corinth did or the Galatians had. But this is not true. They had problems. A couple of examples: first, they were very poor. Paul refers to them in 2 Corinthians 8 & 9. Secondly, they were in the middle of church conflict. Apparently, two women (see chapter 4:2) didn't get along. This had the potential to split the struggling congregation. This is why the Apostle Paul attempted to move their focus to Christ (see chapter 2) instead of dwelling on financial problems and personality conflicts.

There is one final thought that occurs to me. On a given Sunday (and throughout the week), not only is God's Spirit moving within a church but also the enemy. If a church is really serving the Lord, Satan will do his best to disrupt the fellowship and cause division in the church (you can count on it). The devil has many strategies to harm a church. He will use outside pressure like persecution; however, the more successful method is from inside. Strife among members is his delight. Mistrust and innuendo bring him great joy. Whining and complaining are his amusements. Paul, again, warns: "But if you bite and devour one another, beware lest you be consumed by one another" (Galatians 5:15, NKJV). He follows this by encouraging us to, rather, walk in the Spirit–something that I pray each of you wants to do.


It is often difficult to know how to best engage the culture in which we live. We are entering a time in American history where we cannot count on the majority of our culture being "Christianized" anymore or even having an understanding of basic Bible terms. We are entering an era of Biblical illiteracy. It is not that most people know what the Bible says and choose to reject it, it is more simply that they have no idea what the Bible says at all. If we are to be salt and light to this dying culture around us, we need to know how to share our faith in a way that is not mired in language that the lost person of today will not understand.

One of the best ways to begin a conversation (especially around this time of year when people are already thinking about the supernatural) is to ask people if they have any kind of spiritual belief. If you have a decent rapport going, this can give you some valuable insight into their worldview. While you may feel unprepared to answer a question about someone's worldview, you can easily probe deeper just by asking how they know what they believe is true and if they were wrong, would they want to know? Another popular method is to ask someone how many of the Ten Commandments they can name. Most people are at least familiar with the Ten Commandments as a concept but very few know more than a few. This is a great way to explain our innate sin nature as well.

How do we go about this work? One of the key verses that offer guidance is given by Jesus in Matthew 10:16. In this verse Jesus is about to send the disciples out to minister in an environment that has already proven hostile towards his teachings. He advises them, "Behold, I am sending you out as sheep in the midst of wolves, so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves." Jesus wanted his disciples to be effective in their early ministry and he advised them with a twofold command. To be as wise as serpents is to be prepared for the answers you may receive and to know how best to respond to them. However, this is coupled with the admonition to be as innocent as doves. Our message will not be received well if it comes from a spirit of simply wanting to be right and "fight back" against a bad worldview. We need to be in a spirit of wanting to see God change lives, knowing that we cannot change those lives ourselves.

This time of year kids are going back to school and are coming home with answers to their deepest questions that are found in an atheistic and secular worldview. They are being told they are nothing more than cosmic accidents and that their greatest good is to follow the current view of fallible man on every issue imaginable. These kids and families need answers and they need Jesus. Let's make an effort to reach them this fall.

Bible Study 201

Paul's Epistles

Objective: To gain a better understanding of Paul and his belief as a follower of Jesus Christ by studying his letters in chronological order so that we can strengthen our belief in Jesus Christ.

Galatians

Review Chapter 1: Paul introduced himself and explained how he got to where he was and the authenticity of the gospel.

Review Chapter 2: Paul defended the gospel to the Jews and disciples and because of the Gospel there was no difference in believers.

Review Chapter 3: Paul explained that we are justified by faith and heirs of Abraham's seed according to the promise.

Review Chapter 4: Paul explained that believers were adopted and that they are joint heirs with Jesus and that we were free like Isaac, unlike Ishmael the son of the bond woman.

Review Chapter 5: Paul explained that we had freedom with the gospel through Christian Liberty and that love fulfills the law, and that we should walk in the Spirit to avoid lust of the flesh.

Review Chapter 6: Paul states that we should share each other's burdens, be generous to our spiritual leaders, we will reap what we sow whether it is for the Spirit or for the flesh, and what matters to God is that we are changed from the inside out.

This being the first letter that Paul wrote, he is very bold and not afraid to explain the gospel to the disciples that were still supporting the Jewish laws. He stated different ways that Christians are not bound to the Jewish law. That we have liberty from the law after Jesus died on the cross and was raised from the dead, which gave us freedom from the law. He also explained that we should sow according to the Spirit and not the flesh or the influence we have from the world. If we have trusted Jesus, then we have been set free from the world and law.

October 1, we will continue our study with the first chapter of 1 Thessalonians. We meet in room 201 on Sunday mornings at 9:30, and everyone is welcome to attend.


