



Dear Church,

Well, we are a month into 2024. I hope that this new year finds both you and your loved ones doing well.

Last month I introduced our church's vision statement that serves to establish the direction we hope to travel in 2024 and beyond. As you may remember our vision is: *Being the church in Salem and to the nations*. Another way of saying this is "being the church in Salem and beyond." If we were in a boat and each of us had a paddle, this statement serves to set the direction so that we all would be paddling in the same direction. Without a clear direction, some of us would paddle in one direction and others in another. Instead of the boat moving across the water in one direction, we would be spinning in circles.

In addition, in last month's article, we noted the *core values* of our church. Actually, these are the same core values for any church that is biblically based in her approach to life and ministry. You may remember that these values are found in Acts 2:42. These are *devotion to the Bible's instruction* (teaching of the apostles). How can we know what we are to be and do without understand what God has said? Secondly, *devotion to fellowship*. We need each other. Next, is *devotion to breaking bread*. And fourthly, *devotion to prayers*.

Now, I turn to what we are to do, that is, our strategies. These, too, have strong biblical support. These are: evangelism (Matt. 28:16-20), discipleship (Matt. 28:16-20), fellowship (Acts 2:42), ministry (Acts 4:32-37; 6:1-6), and worship (Acts 2:46-47). A memory device that aids in remembering this is: every dead frog must wiggle. Yes, I know that this sentence doesn't make sense but, because of its silly nature, you will remember it. The first letter of each word reminds us of one of the five-fold strategies of a church. This is important because it enables us to evaluate our efforts by whether or not what we do is what we should be doing. There are many worthwhile activities and ministries that we could do; however, the question is "Is this what we should do according to God's Word?" Every ministry, every activity should relate to one of these strategies. There are lots of ministries we can devote our resources to, but these strategies serve as a filter enabling us to be the church in Salem and beyond.

Have you ever met a wizard? They're everywhere in our culture. They promise impossible things and say that if you only trust them and live according to their teachings they will give you everything your heart desires. They promise purpose, belonging, and success. You may be confused as to why I call these people "wizards." They don't typically walk around carrying magic wands or casting mysterious incantations. Despite this, their way of thinking has led many away from the truth.

So what is a wizard? While our modern definition makes us think of a magician or an old man in a pointy hat, there are multiple definitions for the term. In antiquity, a wizard was defined as a "wise man," someone who had a great understanding of the world. People sought out the advice of these wizards then and they still do today. Bookstores are full of self-help books and podcast apps are filled with people advocating that you align their thinking with theirs. With all this advice going around, it's impossible to know where to turn!

The Apostle Paul dealt with a similar struggle in his ministry. The book of Galatians was written to a church that had their own wizard infestation. In fact, Paul used exactly that kind of language to define them. Galatians 3:1 states, "You foolish Galatians, who has bewitched you, before whose eyes Jesus was publicly portrayed as crucified?" The Galatians who had heard the exact same gospel as everyone else had immediately disregarded it in favor of teachings stating they had to follow the Jewish Law to be saved. Paul compares this ideological shift to a "bewitching" as if the Galatians must be under a spell to have rejected the true gospel so quickly.

Today we find Christians all too eager to do the same. One of the best examples of a modern wizard is found in a very famous film you are probably familiar with. This wizard is the Wizard of Oz. At the end of the film the Wizard is exposed as a fraud after promising great gifts to the four brave heroes who defeated the Wicked Witch. However rather than admit he is a fraud, he doubles down and offers all four "gifts" to fulfill their desires. However, these gifts are not what the characters actually desired. They are cheap imitations. Instead of a brain, heart, courage, and home, the characters receive a piece of paper, a clock, a medal, and no way home. The imitations of the wizard are always hollow.

By contrast, Jesus, the true "wise man" offered a different way to find fulfillment. In Matthew 11:28-30 Jesus said, "Come to Me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is comfortable, and my burden is light." Christians are often accused of following all sorts of rules that are impossible to keep. But our Father is merciful and knows that we struggle. Our rules are meant to guide us and keep us on the right path. By following the Wise Man instead of a cultural wizard, we can find something other than a constantly changing standard we cannot live up to. We can find true rest for our souls.
